Hurricane Irma was South Florida's first major hurricane in a decade. There were many types of environmental impacts: tree canopy was reduced, storm debris piled into our streets and landfills, boats sunk and released petroleum, ship groundings and debris impacted seagrasses and mangroves, trees downed powerlines, water quality was affected in Florida Bay, and so much more. We will be examining some of the impacts, discussing the special permitting issues, and gleaning lessons learned so we can be better prepared for the next hurricane season (which is already just months away).

The symposium will be held at the Halmos College of Natural Sciences and Oceanography, located at the north end of the Von D. Mizell and Eula Johnson State Park (formerly John U. Lloyd Beach State Park) directly on the entrance channel of Port Everglades and within steps of the Atlantic Ocean.
